Trail stop 10 – Clem Attlee

Welcome to Clem Attlee Estate!

Clem Attlee estate is one of the largest in the borough with over 600 properties, managed by a mix of different landlord, including H&F council, Notting Hill Genesis, and Network Homes.

There's lots of green projects to see on the estate! In 2020 residents of the Clem Attlee Involvement Team (CAIT) came together to work with Idverde, our grounds maintenance contractor, to deliver wild flower and biodiversity planting.

Residents were also concerned about some tired hedgerows that bordered the main block on the entrance to the estate, which were affected lines of site and meaning the area wasn't looking so inviting. The old hedgerow was removed and prairie grasses and other biodiverse planting has been put in place. In the spring time, the green spaces are transformed by colourful bulb planting. Clem Attlee also has the highest number of secure bike storage spaces on any of our estates, promoting a greener way of getting round the borough.

Clement Richard Attlee, 1st Earl Attlee, KG, OM, CH, PC, FRS was a British politician who served as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1945 to 1951 and Leader of the Labour Party from 1935 to 1955.
