## Urban Ecology Trail Trail stop 1 - Woodmans Mews



The Green Project is a community-led initiative to transform some of the small green spaces on the Wormholt Estate. The project, run by volunteers who live in Wormholt, aims to give all residents access to communal gardening and to experience nature.

The initiative was born during the first lockdown, in March 2020, when it became clear that time in natural, public spaces in the area was in high demand and that there was a desire to improve and cultivate some of the modest, less utilised green spaces on our streets.

In a very short space of time three areas have been transformed, and at the same time have nurtured the wellbeing of our local environment and our local residents.

## DID YOU KNOW..

Wormholt estate was made a conservation area in May 1980. The estate was influenced by Ebenezer Howard's Garden city movement and the Arts and Crafts movement, featuring high quality external detailing and an open setting with privet hedges, front gardens and wide grass verges. H&F council is giving the Green Project a helping hand by funding the installation or railings and gates and planters and seating to help make the areas even more thriving hubs for the community to enjoy.
